Informal Greetings in Ukrainian

Приві́т! Мене́ зва́ти А́нна — Hi! My name is Anna. I am a Ukrainian teacher and native speaker. I am happy to introduce you to your first Lesson Notes for the Ukrainian Lessons Podcast.

Episode #1 is about the very basics of any conversation — saying "hello" and "how are you?". Do you know all the ways to say it in Ukrainian? They are here in these Ukrainian Lessons Podcast lesson notes.

Dialogues

As I mentioned in the podcast, I met with my friends in Shevchenko park in **Ки́їв**; we had some ice cream — **моро́зиво**. Here is how our conversations started:



Анна: **Приві́т!** Інна: **Приві́т!**

Анна: Як справи?

Інна: Чудово! Рада тебе бачити.

Анна: Я теж.

Інна: А у тебе як справи?

Анна: Добре.



Анна: **Приві́т!** Катя: **Приві́т!** Анна: **Як ти?**

Катя: Нормально. А ти як?

Анна: Теж нормально.

Ні! — Привіт!

The basic informal "Hi!" in Ukrainian is:

Привіт!

We use this word very often to greet our friends, close family, and people we work with without any superiority between.

You do not usually say **Привіт!** to your boss or a cashier. We will learn that next time.

It is easy to pronounce /pryvit/ — just smile when you say it! :)

How are you? — Як справи?

There are two ways to ask "How are you?" in Ukrainian. You have heard them both in the dialogues:

Як справи? = Як ти?

What is **спра́ви**? It means something like "things to do". "Як у те́бе спра́ви?" means "How are things with you?"



"Як ти?" simply means "How are you?" We do not translate "are" because in Ukrainian, the verb "to be" in the present tense is usually omitted.

The possible answers to the questions above can be:

- Чудо́во! Great! Wonderful!
- Ду́же до́бре! Very good!
- **Добре.** Fine.
- Норма́льно. Normal, I am okay.
- Пога́но. Bad.
- Ду́же пога́но. Very bad.

This is how to ask Як справи? back:

А у тебе?

Literally, it means "And with you?"

And that is how we ask back for **Як ти?**:

А ти як? = **А** як ти?

The word order does not matter, as in many cases in the Ukrainian language.

Pay attention to a short and common word:

Α

It means "and" and is used when we are talking about contrasting things, especially at the beginning of a sentence or between two sentences, for example:

- Я люблю́ чай, а він лю́бить ка́ву.

 I like tea, and he likes coffee.
- Я люблю́ зеле́ний чай. А ти?
 I like green tea. And you?

I am glad to see you — Рада тебе бачити!

Inna said one sentence that could be very useful to you when you meet Ukrainians, and you are glad to see them.

Pay attention to gender. Men use the first phrase below. Women use the second one:

Радий тебе бачити!

Рада тебе бачити!

These are the basics of Ukrainian adjectives: most of them are masculine and end in -um while some are feminine and end in -a.

Also — Також

These are three ways of saying "also/too" in Ukrainian:

також

теж

The first two are just options for stress.

In the dialogues, we used **τεж**, but we could have used **τάκόж** with no difference in meaning:



- Ра́да тебе́ ба́чити!
- Я теж *or* Я та́ко́ж.



- A ти як?
- Теж нормально *or* Також нормально.
